**Together we've done really well so far, let's continue the good work for the remaining weekends to Christmas**

October and November were the busiest months for container throughput in the history of the port and we saw a total of over 313,000 TEUs traded in those two months alone. What a fantastic effort! Truck queues have been reducing, thanks to all the hard work and of course the great take up of weekend truck slots.

The Patrick terminal reported 100% take up of the day slots last Saturday, though DP World was less busy. While the take up of evening and Sunday slots was encouraging, we could do much better.

This weekend we still have above average vessel movements scheduled, with 17 on Saturday and 15 on Sunday. Importantly, 18 container vessel movements are planned to and from Brotherson Dock.
