CONSTRUCTION UPDATE – SYDNEY PORT BOTANY TERMINAL 3

Commenced Works

Laing O'Rourke, on behalf of Sydney International Container Terminals, has now commenced construction of the Sydney Port Botany Terminal 3 (SPBT3) ports facility with stage one of the project planned to be completed by late 2013.

Work activities that have commenced include:

- Site establishment and site compound set-up including sheds required for site personnel and creation of temporary site access roads
- Installation of environmental controls such as turbidity curtains within Penrhyn Estuary, silt fencing and wind erosion fencing
- Ground improvement and earthworks on the reclaimed land to allow for paving and concrete works to proceed in the coming months
- Installation of drainage outlets to link with the operational ports drainage system. This includes the installation of Stormwater Quality Improvement Devices (SQIDs) that remove silt and oil from stormwater entering the surround bay and estuary when the terminal becomes operational
- Relocation of Saltmarsh located within Penrhyn Estuary to allow drainage works to be completed, with 100% of the removed Saltmarsh successfully replanted to other areas of the estuary by our Wetlands Ecologists



Coming Up

Laing O'Rourke will continue with the current work activities listed above. Further drainage, services and utilities work will commence shortly.
